K2	Increasing engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity and sport. <i>(The UK Chief Medical Officers recommend that all children and young people should take part in moderate to vigorous intensity physical activity for at least 60 minutes every day. The Childhood Obesity Plan says that at least 30 minutes of daily activity should take place in schools.)</i>
K3	Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement.
K4	Offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils.
K5	Increase participation in competitive sport.
